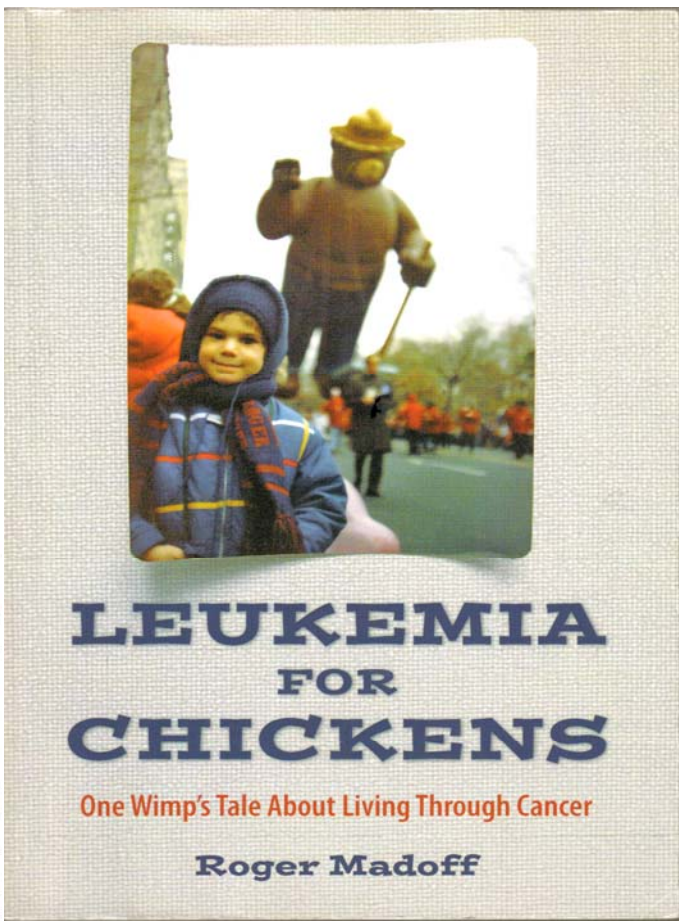

## **Jennifer Stevens Madoff, DrPH**

### **Understanding Cancer in Young Adults through First Person Narrative**

Jennifer Madoff, DrPH, is on the faculty of the Department of Sociomedical Sciences in the Mailman School of Public Health. She published her late husband Roger Madoff's memoir, *Leukemia for Chickens*, which recounts their experiences living with cancer.

First person narratives give us a window into the experiences of change and loss that are brought on by illness for patients and caregivers. In medicine in particular, first person accounts are essential tools in approaching treatment, as we gain a greater appreciation of the patient experience, as described in their own words and put in their own context.
